Living life in all its fullness

ere at Batheaston Church School we've been enjoying a busy term, with pupils taking part in lots of fun activities to enrich their learning experience. We've worked hard over the last few years creating and evolving a "bespoke" curriculum that is engaging for all our children. So now, with our exciting curriculum well and truly embedded, we're looking beyond the school gates for new ways to bring all this learning to life.

Easter chicks have paid a special visit to Willow class. The class was very excited. These tiny bundles of fluff were a huge hit. The children so enjoyed watching them and learning all about where they come from. This visit formed a part of Willow's science topic.

The drama company PERFORM was very popular with Apple, Cherry and Willow classes. On their recent visit, the company led pupils in a drama workshop based on traditional fairy tales. The children enjoyed dancing, and moving around the hall as the different characters.

Collage artist Marion Hill spent time with our younger pupils at the start of May helping them create beautiful collages. These mainly centred on the re-introduction of beavers into our local area. As well as the artwork they produced, pupils learnt much about beavers, and were also inspired to write about these exquisite creatures. We still have lots more events planned for this academic year, including a visit from willow sculpture artist Julie Starks and a return visit from documentary filmmaker and conservation photographer Alex Domanski.

As you see, we are giving pupils opportunities to work alongside real life experts, who can inspire them and introduce them to a world of knowledge beyond the curriculum. In this way we are constantly enriching their learning. Our renowned vision of Dream...Aspire...Achieve is firmly embedded in our school life and is at the heart of everything we do. Our mission will always be for our pupils to flourish, and to be excited and inspired by the experiences and opportunities we seek to provide.

National Trust

ummer at Bathampton Meadows. After an incredibly wet start to '24 and much flooding on the Meadows, it's been wonderful to see spring come, and now to look forward to summer events. In spring our work focuses on tidying up. We've been chipping the brash from the hedges and using it as mulch. This will keep nettles at bay and help trees retain moisture if we get another drought like last year's. Butterfly surveys have started up again, and we'll be doing more bat surveys towards summer. I've recently been checking our signage across the Meadows, to see if it's fit for purpose or whether improvements are needed.

We've been out and about, helping people find out about work on the Meadows and have their say about future planning. Back in April, I spent the day at Bath Guildhall celebrating World Heritage Day. Bath's landscape forms a significant part of the city's UNESCO World Heritage status. With a colleague from Prior Park Landscape Garden, and we chatted to visitors about the National Trust's local landscapes - Prior

Park, Bath Skyline and Bathampton Meadows. We were also at the Larkhall Festival in May and we'll be at Batheaston's Riverside Festival in July.

During June and July we'll be running drop-in sessions. Much like last year, we'll have some gazebos around the meadows where anyone can drop by and have a chat. We'll have displays about our future plans, and summaries of our last year's findings. Look out for the posters or check the website for details of dates, times and locations.

We are grateful to all our usual volunteer groups and now we've been welcoming help from Bath's branch of GoodGym. This offers a practical hand to whoever in the city needs this, either charities and locals, rather than going for gym membership. A group came for a morning to help us remove some stubborn old fenceposts and wiring from the meadows, ready for the fenceposts to be replaced.

f you need help or support, there are plenty of organisations out there. But finding out how and where to access them can be difficult. This is where your Village Agent can help. As part of the B&NES Community Wellbeing Hub we have a direct line of contact to around thirty partners, who offer a range of services to improve your health

The Hub acts as a central point of contact and provides a triage (sorting) service to direct you to the best solution. Our range of partners covers most needs, including:

- · Financial and money matters
- Keeping active and healthy
- Achieving a healthy weight
- · Accessing food

and wellbeing.

- · Mental health and wellbeing support
- Lifestyles services e.g. stopping smoking
- · Social prescribing
- · Housing advice
- · Home from Hospital services
- Employment, skills and training
- · Wellbeing courses and volunteering
- · Supporting carers, family members & others

As part of the Hub, Village Agents are put in touch with people in our community who need our support. Being a partner has also helped us work more collaboratively with other organisations, such as Age UK, Clean Slate, the Stoke Association and Alzheimer's Society, to name a few.

The Hub also has a presence in the Atrium of the R.U.H. (on the left as you go through the main doors). Some of the Village Agent team can often be found there, representing the Hub, so you can be sure to find a friendly face! They can give you more information about the partners that make up the Hub and can guide you through the process of making contact.
