ature on our doorstep and Summer is on its way. Mike's Meadow, our wonderful woodland space, is becoming a hive of activity. Trees, plants and flowers are hosting thriving populations of insects and small animals. The Meadow provides our children with a great wealth of opportunities for playing and learning.

We've been collaborating once again with the Beaver Trust. Marion Hill, Willow sculpturer Julie Sparks and filmmaker Aleks Domanski have all run specialist sessions for the children. Trees in our lovely woodland area were adorned with willow artworks, all handmade by the children in Reception and KS1. River wildlife inspired KS2 pupils to make collage pictures worthy of display at Bathampton Meadows. And the shy beaver is now a much-loved friend of our school. Who knows if one day we'll catch sight of one in the brook alongside our playground?

Forest School sessions, funded by FoBS and run by Creative Roots leader Dominika, continue to be firm favourites with the children. The sessions provide the children with opportunities for purposely exploring the natural

environment. Whittling and making clay nests prove popular with everyone.

With summer come warmer days, and our youngest pupils in Apple Class have been able to spend a whole day outdoors with their Year 6 Special Friends. On the menu were den making, leaf printing and clay craft. It was so good to observe how secure friendships are across the age gap. We watched the children all playing and taking great delight in completing challenges together. They were demonstrating the values we hold dear as a school community.

Our much loved Mike's Meadow lunchtimes have started up again this term. For this we rely on parent volunteers to come to support staff and ensure that all the children can access the meadow safely, and have a lot of fun. These lunchtimes will continue for the rest of the academic year, giving further opportunities for parents to come in support – and have fun themselves!

y name is Hannah Squire, and I am one of 9 residents of Batheaston who make up the Parish Council.
We have big plans ... bigger than we are able to take on without your help.

We'd like to:

- · Create a "new Rhymes Pavilion"
- Upgrade the over-5's equipment in the playground, replacing the climbing frame and the swings
- Refurbish the netball court to have a modern all-weather surface, for all sorts of sports
- Refurbish and enhance the toilet block and the car park

We already have groups in place (sometimes with only one member!) to:

- Oversee the Riverside, including the Secret and Forest Gardens
- Prepare against floods and other emergencies
- Help us scrutinise and comment on Planning Applications in the Parish
- Look after the natural environment in our Parish
- Lead on matters concerning roads, parking and transport, with an ambition to set up Community Speedwatch Groups
- · Manage the Elmhurst Growing Spaces

The Parish Council also looks after the village's environment, litter-picking, mowing grass and looking after footpaths. And we have formal roles such as liaising with the Police and others, and input into the long-term plans for developing the village. Finally, the Council is responsible for its staff and budget.

We welcomed Spring joyfully with a maypole dance, and we recently took a field trip to the University of Bath to explore different ways of being and learning in the world.

We're grateful for the warm welcome the village has given us and look forward to more shared experiences in this vibrant community.

What's been happening on Bathampton Meadows

e've been restoring and creating new hedgerows for the Meadows. This Spring we've planted hazel, willow and other hedgerow trees, helped by various groups and volunteers.

In March we welcomed the Bath-Alkmaar Twinning Association (BATA) in its 80th year. Ranger Volunteers and BATA volunteers joined the Deputy Mayor of Bath and the General Manager of National Trust Bath in planting whips of hazel, alder buckthorn, holly, dog rose, oak, and crab apple. These will complement the elder, blackthorn and hawthorn already in the hedges, increase species biodiversity and create green corridors for birds and bats. The Mayor of Alkmaar will be visiting in July when she should see all the young shoots.

Cut willow and hazel strands then let us get really creative, so we ran a sold-out garden obelisk workshop at the end of April, also making the willow fishes. These plants have so much to offer.

New Visitors: The youth group from Mentoring Plus joined me for harvesting and planting willow and for making fish from its bendy

strands (as mentioned above). We have also welcomed hard-working agricultural students from Lackham and Bridgwater Colleges, who learned new skills when helping erect for us 200m of chestnut fencing. This will protect our newly-laid hedge from nibbling sheep. Thank-you to all who helped – it looks most professional!

I've yet to see the full cycle of seasons on the Meadows. Recently I've particularly enjoyed seeing the trees coming back to life, adorned with catkins, my favourite being the goat willow, flamboyant and yellow. And we've had some discoveries. A butterfly survey volunteer has spotted white and peacock butterflies, adding to the orange tip already sighted.

Do watch out for new artwork on Batheaston footbridge. Old artwork, created some years ago by children from Batheaston Church School, has been removed. New school artwork goes up at the beginning of June to coincide with the Wild Waters Festival.

I am often out and about with my volunteers – do come and say hello.

Batheaston Parish Council

A brief summary from the Parish Clerk of recent meetings which included some important budgetary and financial decisions



tits February meeting, the Council confirmed its Precept for 2025/26.

This is its income, collected as part of Council Tax. Councillors were keen to continue to grow funds to develop and improve its amenities for the village but were also keen not to add to the financial burden on residents. They therefore decided on a 4% increase for householders, totalling £135,240. Some of the money has been allocated to an increase in the Clerk's time to take forward projects. See the separate article for an overview of these projects and lots of ways in which you can help.

The Parish Council has recently made grants to community organisations: to the Youth Club, £7,000, to support its valuable work with the young people of the village; and to Grow Batheaston, £1,500, to provide much of the costs of its day-to-day operations and £1,000 for the "Tales from our River Bank" event on 6th June. The Council deferred a decision on a further request from Grow Batheaston, for £1,500 to support the Village Art Trail in September. It also purchased a brush cutter at a cost of approximately £1,000, to be used by the Cotswolds Volunteer Wardens in their


fantastic work maintaining the Parish's 12 miles of footpaths.

The Parish Council has a responsibility to review and comment on Planning Applications on behalf of the community. In recent months it has objected to developments that it sees as exacerbating traffic or parking issues in the village. It has also joined with neighbouring parishes to urge Bath and North East Somerset Council to take action on the significant development of Charmydown Barns, which has been undertaken without planning permission.

Another aspect of the Council's work is to beautify the centre of the village: the Council approved £1,000 for this summer's hanging baskets and planters, and to tidy up the vegetation alongside the Penthouse Steps. Councillors are also looking at ways to commemorate the 80th Anniversary of VE-VJ Day this summer.

Last but not least, Councillors are busy planning the **Riverside Party** for Sunday 8th June, as part of the Wild Waters Festival, celebrating the River Avon east of Bath and its tributaries.
