



I would like to highlight just a few local groups and activities that stand out to me. Penny's Pantry, the community group set up during the Covid pandemic to bring residents together, meets every Wednesday at the Rhymes Pavilion from 10am – Noon. All are welcome to attend. My fellow ward councillor Sarah Warren and I visit Penny's Pantry between 11am – 12 noon on the last Wednesday of every month. Do come along to say hello, and let us know if you have any local issues you'd like to raise.

The National Trust is developing a new woodland pasture on Bathampton Meadows. This autumn they held a community tree planting event open to people of all ages. It gave residents the chance to learn from the National Trust rangers about tree planting, and then to leave a lasting, positive legacy. This excellent work is ongoing.

As winter approaches, I want to mention a challenge all communities face: isolation. We need to look out for each other, especially for the most vulnerable in our midst. Please reach out to anyone you are concerned about. Help is available for those dealing with issues such as the cost of living and fuel poverty. Finally, a shout out to our popular Youth Club, a safe local space where our youngsters can socialise. My warmest thanks go to those who volunteer there – and indeed to all who help make the village such a wonderful place to live.

The Power of Music in Early Childhood

usic is more than just fun for young children—it's essential for their development. Regular musical play boosts language, memory, social skills, coordination and emotional connection.

Music matters because singing, dancing and sound play activate every part of a child's growing brain. Music enhances communication and learning while building joyful, responsive relationships. It isn't about singing in tune or learning lyrics. It's about listening, responding and sharing joyful sound-making moments with our children.

Follow your Child's Sound

If they coo, squeak or bang a block —pause, listen, then copy this back with a little musical twist. That way you're saying: "I hear you!" Don't rush to fill quiet moments - give your child time to respond musically in their own way.

Create Micro-Songs

Make up ditties for everyday moments like nappy changes and brushing teeth. Look up Steve Grocott's fabulous song Washing Machine and thank me later! Try using well-known tunes and incorporate your own extra verses. We sang a version of Old MacDonald to help our daughter

spell her name. These days I randomly burst into song, as when encouraging my puppy to be calm.

Set up an Inviting Sound Station

For spontaneous play arrange a basket of props (like scarves) and household sound-makers, (like shakers, drums or woodblocks). Try making the basket up in the garden. I recently suspended a cymbal from a tree branch so it will resonate with the rain and make a pleasing sound. It's been very dry so far this summer, but I'll ask the neighbours what they think after the next storm!

Play Interesting Music Daily

Create a playlist of diverse recordings that your child can enjoy. Use the playlist during mealtimes, playtime or winding down time.

Singing Tree Classes

Noeline has taught musical skills through play in Batheaston since 2019, using the child-centred Kodály Approach. Classes run Fridays at 9:30 am at Batheaston New Village Hall and are open to babies, toddlers, and pre-schoolers (and their parents/carers!).

Batheaston Annual Village Meeting – Summary

Batheaston Annual Village Meeting, was held on 25th March at the New Village Hall. The evening, chaired by Parish Council Chair Hannah Squire, featured updates, presentations, and discussions on ongoing and upcoming initiatives in the village.

he monthly Film Club and an Art
Sale supporting Parkinson's UK were
noted. Two special presentations
followed. Michael Auton from Community
Catalysts introduced their work supporting
local people wanting to set up small businesses
to assist older adults and people with
disabilities. Forbes Robertson of the Twinning
Association shared plans to celebrate 20 years
of partnership with Oudon, France.
These are to include Oudon's visit here in July
and a French Café event on 8th June.

Parish Councillor Peter Lewis outlined the Council's responsibilities and upcoming projects, speaking especially of:

- The formation of a Batheaston Emergency Response Team (BERT) to address future emergencies (in light of recent flooding).
- The need to re-establish a village pre-school nursery.
- The Council's need for more councillors and more volunteers!

Tina Lewis announced plans to launch Bingo sessions at the Rhymes Pavilion. Grow Batheaston representatives highlighted their community efforts, including seed swaps and plant sales, the forest garden, junior football coaching and the September Art Trail. Grow Batheaston and the Parish Council are both to run events at the Wild Waters Festival: respectively "Tales from our River Bank" on 6th June and the Riverside Party on Sunday afternoon, 8th June.

Rob Kendall spoke on creating an accessible route on Bannerdown Common for people with limited mobility.

Cllr Sarah Warren updated attendees on:

- Plans to restore the riverside limestone link footpath.
- The Local Plan, which sets out how the Council will achieve its target for housebuilding over the next 20 years.
- The financial pressure on local authorities, noting that B&NES had managed to balance its budget.

The perennial issue of bus services arose. This had been covered in some detail at last year's meeting.

The meeting concluded with thanks to the New Village Hall Trustees and a call for speaker suggestions for next year's meeting.

A Joyful Summer for the Green House Education Project

he Green House Education Project has enjoyed a wonderfully busy and creative summer term in Batheaston. We are very grateful, and feel so welcome in the Youth Club. We have been making the most of the facilities there, and of the beautiful local outdoor spaces which are ideal for play and exploration. We were delighted to be part of the Church Fete and ended the term with our own Summer Festival, held alongside the Rainbow Group's anniversary of their dementia day care project. On that occasion it was heart warming to see different generations connect—especially while meeting a pony and

enjoying performances by our young people. These included music, acrobatics, and a life-sized chess game.

We are looking forward to welcoming new families in September and to taking part in the Batheaston Arts Trail.

A Lot Has Been Happening on Bathampton Meadows

e have been busy again with tree planting on Bathampton Meadows.
This has now gone from months of planning to full operational mode. First, we constructed a livestock corral in the eastern fields, linked to our permissive path plan. And then we made wood pasture fencing for the central fields.

As part of woodland planning, the Bath National Trust Volunteers (BNTV) joined me in planting colour-coded tree stakes to aid our community planting events. It was a tricky task with maps, colours and numbers, but 90% of the 4,000 stakes were placed in just a few hours. I also took receipt of 10,000 cell-grown trees, plastic-free tree guards, wool mulching material and 36,000 bamboo pegs, all with the help of my volunteers.

I have been inspired by our hard-working butterfly volunteers. They have surveyed from Grosvenor bridge all the way to Batheaston bridge. Overall, they spotted 432 butterflies compared to 226 in 2024, and this included a high brown fritillary. There were increases from 2024 in green-veined white, small white, gatekeeper and orange tip butterflies among

others, which is great news. Thanks again to all who helped with this work.

Our woodland fence works are now almost complete, and our contractor is about to start fencing 1km for new hedgerows on the eastern sheep fields. It is very satisfying to see the positive progress of our Forest of Avon funded project.

Now we have 10,000 tree plugs waiting to be planted this autumn/winter, and I look forward to updating you all on progress in the Batheaston Times Spring 2026 edition. We have refined our process in preparation for numerous schools, corporate groups, community and NT volunteer groups who want to take part. And of course we have an Open Planting Day on 25th October.

• If you would still like to be involved in planting trees in our new wood pasture, we are planning another Community Planting Event on Sunday 22 February '26. Be sure to keep an eye on our website, and we'll be sharing updates on social media too.

10,000 is at hand! The Parish Council has allocated up to £10,000 for a project to be led by members of the community. Here are some of the ideas, from our long list of aspirations for the village:

- Further improving the Playground replacing the over-5's equipment
- Establishing a woodland walk along St Catherine Brook from the Playground along the side of the football pitch
- Creating a "Batheaston trail", with information boards, interpretive maps, and QR codes for more information online
- Developing a strategy and project(s) for the young people of the village
- Installing defibrillators and other medical emergency equipment
- Opening up the eastern end of the Riverside Park, to make the area more inviting

Please let us know if you - perhaps with others - are interested in taking on a project. For this you will be supported by the Parish Council and the Clerk, and we will carry out formal processes such as procurement of equipment and services. We would be happy to talk through the ideas. The budget of up to £10,000 has been allocated, but more money could be available for a project if it is needed.

Projects will be selected by the Parish Council at its meeting on 13th January, based on an assessment of the benefit to the village, and the costs and resources needed.


