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

e've had a busy spring, plants and trees going into the Forest Garden, meadow planting, sports and fitness offerings, whilst also being busy preparing for the first Pop-Up Markets & October Art Trail. We're pleased to have completed the first phase of the Meadows Project and have installed a community notice board near the Orchard slope where you can see, courtesy of Bathscape, one of Marian Hill's insect posters detailing what creatures can be seen in grassland.

In the Forest Garden we are working with plans to start an affordable parent and toddler group with Foxgloves Forest School in September. As well as finishing the paths, there will be more trees, climbing plants along the back wall, opportunities to make tepees from pallets, plans for a mud kitchen, as well as bird & bat boxes, arches, gates, raised beds, the list goes on! We are also working with Bath University Action Project and have tasked our group of postgraduate students to help us engage more with 14-21 years old. The students have come up with the idea of holding a Water Festival on

On June 25th we held our annual Fete at the Batheaston Village Hall after a two year break because of Covid, and I do hope that many of you enjoyed that typical village event. It is the major fund-raiser for St John's and it is great to see so many having fun at the same time. Then looking ahead, St John's will once again be hosting a part of the Art Trail the first weekend of October. Your small band of Parish Councillors spent many hours (often in the George and Dragon!) planning how best to celebrate the Jubilee; to throw a party that would mark such a momentous occasion properly in Batheaston.

By all accounts, the party was a great success. The High Street and the Riverside Park made a great location for the party, with a stage and marquee, especially adorned with 500m of bunting! It was wonderful to see so many residents – young and old alike – enjoying the bands and other entertainment on the riverside, the food and drink available from our bars and from establishments on the High Street, and the cream teas.

Some of the notable successes were the chalk for the children to draw on the walls and pavements (the Union Jacks are still there on the wall!); the golden crowns; the balloon modelling; Punch and Judy and of course the music – the fab DJ and Steve Robinson. And we just about managed to survive til the downpour in the evening!

We'd like to thank everyone who helped, and

everyone who came along! Wouldn't it be brilliant if we could have a summer party every year?

Improving the Playground – first phase complete!

The first phase of the upgrade is now complete. We made some urgent repairs to potentially unsafe equipment. We had £18,900 of "Section 106" money to spend, which would have expired had we not done the work quickly. So, there was a double sense of urgency. The biggest concern was the slide, which was starting to have jagged edges, so we replaced this, and took the opportunity to install a climbing net alongside. The smaller repairs and enhancements included: making the Cradle Swing foundations firm; replacing and retensioning the Zip-Wire Seat; repairing and replacing benches.

It was a real joy to see so many people enjoying a delicious lunch and live music in this lovely facility after all the isolation imposed by Covid. I can't wait to see even more people at the next one we are planning.

The new Village Hall also hosts the new weekly Parent Carers' group, a support group for parents of children with Special Educational Needs. This is open to any parent during term time on Fridays 10.30-12.30.

As well as supporting these groups I can also help individuals on a one-to-one basis with a range of issues such as:

- Finding appropriate support if you or a loved one is struggling to live independently at home
- Access to benefits
- Struggling with finances, bills or debt

As I live in the village you will probably see me around, at the school gate or down by the river. However the service I provide is entirely confidential and free to all residents of B&NES.
