

Celebrating and documenting the crucial role Batheaston played in winning women's suffrage, our village hall will also be staging a suffragette exhibition. Photos and suffragette artefacts will bring this pivotal period of history to life. You will also notice that the bunting clearly marking out all venues on the Batheaston Art Trail is in that movement's signature colours of purple, white and green.

There you can see the one surviving "memorial" tree they planted. You could also drop in on the pop-up café in the garden. Various studios have refreshments on offer. Snack lunches and drinks are also available at St. John the Baptist Church.

"We hope you will come along and make a day or weekend of it," says Piu Bose, ceramicist and cyanotype artist, and one of the Batheaston Art Trail organisers. She adds: "It is the perfect opportunity to explore a new art form or two, as well as to buy some unique gifts that will support local artists and small businesses."

On Saturday 1st October early risers can begin their day by visiting our village's increasingly popular Pop-Up Market. It is run by the community group Grow Batheaston, and takes place at the riverside by the village car park from 9am to 1pm.





Batheaston Parish Council provides recreation and other facilities, maintains some of the local environment, and represents the community



he focus for the Parish Council in the coming months will be the improvement of the Playground.
Councillors are very aware how important the Playground and Park are to the community, as a place where childhood memories are made and friendships fostered, and where parents and others have a chance to relax! We are lucky that we have such a great space in the centre of the village, right beside the primary school.

So – after a number of years without major investment – the Councillors are making this the priority. This began in the winter when some critical repairs were carried out, with the installation of a new slide and climbing net. The main phase of the project is getting under way now. The Parish Council has established a Working Group, made up of representatives of the village – from the Parish Council, Grow Batheaston and fellow residents & parents – all of whom are passionate about the Playground and Park. The hope is to provide new and updated play equipment, improve access and the general environment, and – if funding can

be found – to improve the skate ramp and the all-weather court.

On 1st October, the Working Group are running a Park Party Event – which is intended to serve as an opportunity to engage people in the project, to get their input, ideas and offers of help. It will also we hope serve as a great day for the community to come together, and will feature live music, a BBQ, a skate show, graffiti art, and more. The Working Group has also run an online survey, which is at bit.ly/bathplaypark.

safety of the King. Since then, November 5th has
become known as Bonfire Night.

The 23rd (Avonvale) Bath Scout Group has been running the Batheaston Bonfire Night celebrations for the last 10 years, and the event has grown significantly over that time.

The pandemic was a considerable challenge, but in true scouting style the team found a way to keep the event running. In 2020 we hosted a watch-from-home event and 2021 we put on another watch-from-home, this time with restricted numbers actually present.

National Trust

The National Trust is delighted to announce the creation of a 'green corridor' at Bathampton Meadows, linking the historic city centre to surrounding countryside.

ver the summer we have been busy finding out more about Bathampton Meadows and getting to know the local community. This will help us develop long-term plans for people and nature in this beautiful stretch of countryside.

We have been soil sampling, to find out the nutrient and carbon levels in the Meadows' various fields. This shows us what kinds of species would thrive there, before we start sowing seed or planting trees.

By repeating these studies in future years, we can measure if we are successfully sequestering more carbon in the soil. Our nature conservation advisors have done habitat surveys, assessing current levels of biodiversity and finding what already lives here. And our partners at Bathscape have led a bat walk, where we - and some very excited children - discovered the great number of bats using the river as a corridor.

Soon we hope to do hydrological modelling to show us where we might want to make water changes - for example by creating ponds. We also plan a geophysical survey, looking for what archaeology might lie beneath the soil.

We've also been meeting local people at various events. In September we had stalls at Kensington Meadows Family Fun Day, Batheaston Pop-up Market, and Bathampton Village Show. We have found a great range of ideas and opinions about the management of the Meadows, but one thing that is very clear is how much they mean to so many of you. We will continue to engage with the local community as we draw up a first draft plan. This will be based on your feedback and the results of our various surveys and pieces of research. We will then share this for further consultation.

In the meantime, we have recruited a Ranger to support the Meadows' management and we will soon be looking for volunteers to get involved in various roles - we'll tell you more in the next edition!
