layground Update: Our Working
Group is now tackling the Under-5
playground area. We are talking to
companies that can provide and
install a replacement climbing frame and
other things that toddlers love to play on.
The aim is to have these installed on a new
play surface by June. We will then turn
to other playground areas, replacing the
larger climbing frame and bringing in other
equipment. Then it's on to the skate ramp,
and the all-weather court! In parallel, I will
soon be commissioning repair of the fence
and replacement of the yellow gate.

Volunteers Needed! We are still keen to hear from people who want to help – could you roll your sleeves up and help dig out the overgrown bark surface, or perhaps raise funds for our playground's next phase?

Streetlight News: This year quite a few of the Council's remaining streetlights have needed attention, and so far over £5,000 has been committed to their repair or replacement. In a couple of cases, we decided to decommission the light, to save money.

Precept for Next Year: At a special meeting on 1st February, the Parish Council agreed to increase this to about £90 for a house in Council Tax middle band D. This is a large increase but the assets the Council manages for the community - Riverside, Playground, and sports facilities – need substantial investment. The Chair of Council, Cllr Hannah Squire, published this statement on behalf of Councillors:

I have been ordained for 17 years and I've had a lot of experience of different parishes, but there are always surprises and things to learn, so please let me know your thoughts and concerns. urrent Financial Pressures: As we finally head (hopefully!) towards some warmer spring weather, everyone is hoping that financial pressures from the cost of living crisis/rising energy bills will ease somewhat. Over the winter I've been supporting more people than ever, helping them access financial support, benefits and one-off payments when times have been particularly tough. No one is immune in the current situation, so don't be afraid to ask for help.

A very special Christmas Community Lunch, hosted by Penny's Pantry, gave a lovely and festive day for us all. It was held at Batheaston New Village Hall, the choir from Batheaston Primary School entertaining everyone with Christmas carols. We are offering lunches on a monthly basis, the next one being on FRIDAY 17th MARCH. It will have an Irish theme to mark St Patrick's Day. Everyone is welcome, both young and old, and a £5 voluntary contribution is appreciated. A welcome drink, 2 course meal, coffee/tea and biscuits is all included. Accessing Help: Finally, just a reminder that I am here to support anyone over the age of 18 in the village. I can help with a range of issues such as:

- Changing care needs

I am always happy to have a cup of tea and a chat, either at your own home or over the phone, and help find a solution. This service is entirely confidential and free to all residents of B&NES.

I also have contact with many local agencies that can help with more specialist needs.







The National Trust is delighted to announce the creation of a 'green corridor' at Bathampton Meadows, linking the historic city centre to surrounding countryside.

Year's Progress: It's now almost a year since the National Trust took on Bathampton Meadows, its first "green corridor". We promptly set to work surveying the land so that we could understand it better. We took soil samples, analysed the fungi, did a bat count and studied all the natural habitats so that we could monitor any changes over time. This has put us in a great position to move forward over the next year and develop the Meadows both for nature and for visitors.

Forging Local Links: We are engaging with the local community, finding out what's important to you, and what you specially like about the Meadows. On Friday 23rd December we took twenty people on a guided - and rather wet - walk from Batheaston through to Kensington Meadows. Afterwards over some mince pies rangers shared their discoveries of the last year. It was a lovely way to meet local residents. Look out for more events like this one in the coming months.

An Ancient Tree: You may know the oak that stands in one of the Meadow fields where we graze sheep. We have called in one of our National Trust tree experts, who confirms that the tree is at least 850 years old, though it's hard to give its exact age.

Calling All Volunteers! I am delighted to tell you that we are now recruiting. Firstly, we are looking for coast and countryside volunteers to support our rangers in a practical way, and allow us to keep the Meadows in great condition. Work will include hedge laying, wildflower meadow maintenance and scrub clearance.
