Batheaston Parish Council provides recreation and other facilities, maintains some of the local environment, and represents the community



ur Village Coronation Party was a great success thanks to everyone who helped, either by coming along or by working behind the scenes. We are already planning a party for the same time next year (with or without a royal event!)

The Playground Working Group has made great progress. As I write, the under-5's equipment – and weeds and what was left of the play bark – have been removed. Very soon the installation of the new play area will get started.

We want to thank the team from Future Positive for help with the arduous task of removing the existing equipment and weed membrane. Parish Councillor Kate Skelton has also done a great job calling in favours from local suppliers and her husband Charlie has also done much preparatory work. These volunteers are enabling us to spend more on the actual facilities for the children.

Soon we will be refurbishing equipment for older children, and improving the skate ramp and the all-weather court. We will also be opening up access to the St Catherine's Brook. Please get in touch if you want to help.

The Rhymes Pavilion: Councillors are mindful

that this costs about £7,000 p.a. to keep open, and is not being as well used as it once was. A range of options will be considered from refurbishment to replacement. Whatever happens, Councillors are clear that they want to build on all that the Rhymes has meant to the village.

The Riverside Area continues to be a great asset and we appreciate the work of the volunteers who look after the Secret Garden, and the new Forest Garden. Turning from horticulture to aquaculture, the Council is striving for a cleaner river. We have generous support for this from Surfers Against Sewage. We need real-time awareness of water quality. Over the bathing season we will be taking weekly lab-accredited water quality tests and reporting the results to you.

There's lots going on ... and we are still keen for residents to join the Council or help in other ways!

Batheaston Village Agent – WERN (West of England Rural Network)



hey say Prevention is Better than a Cure – as a Village Agent I can help get things in place so that you stay well, whether that's making adaptions to your home or making sure you are claiming what you're entitled to such as Attendance Allowance or Disability Living Allowance. I keep my ear to the ground and make it my business to find out what services and support there is in Batheaston and the local area. So if you have a problem or

a concern, I am able to point you in the right direction and support you through the process. I'm always happy to have a cup of tea and a chat and see what I can do to help.

Caring about Carers

Village Agents understand how hard it can be if you find yourself caring for a loved one or friend. All sorts of emotions are involved and it can often feel like you're on your own. Perhaps it's time to bring in some extra hands to help take the strain? Or I can put you in touch with specialist services that can support you as a Carer, perhaps by accessing peer support or taking time out to improve your own wellbeing.

Community Wellbeing Hub

WERN Village Agents are one of the partners in the B&NES Community Wellbeing Hub which allows us to provide a stronger response to any issues that may arise in your life or to

improve your general health and wellbeing. Some difficult situations can only be resolved by professionals working together to tackle all the different elements. It might be that a person's anxiety is due to their housing situation, which is dependent on their financial status, which in turn is being affected by their health issues. In complex cases like this, we turn to specialist partners via the Hub to try and make improvements or plan a route to better wellbeing. In turn, our partners at the Hub refer people to the Village Agents if there is something we can help with at a local level. The National Trust is delighted to announce the creation of a 'green corridor' at Bathampton Meadows, linking the historic city centre to surrounding countryside.

s spring turns to summer Bathampton Meadows are looking lovely. Even if we ourselves haven't enjoyed the wet weather, the grass and flowers certainly have. It's been a busy few months with new volunteers getting stuck in, helping with numerous tasks including cleaning up following the unexpected floods of early spring!

We have planted over 1,500 trees across the meadows, many in the hedgerows to help establish new wildlife habitats. And if you've seen some brown mud patches appearing in the fields, that's because we are testing wildflower seed mixes. We're sowing each site with a different mix, to check which best suit the various areas and offer the best diversity for pollinators. This research will be used to inform planting in future years.

Our new web pages www.nationaltrust.org. uk/visit/bath-bristol/bathampton-meadows are now available. These will help visitors plan their walking routes, find out about seasonal highlights and access information about our whole Meadows project. Have you spotted our new noticeboards? There's one at the Batheaston entrance and one at the entrance closest to Kensington Meadows. We'll use these to display information on seasonal work we are doing and to promote any activities that may be taking place. Dates haven't been confirmed yet, but do look out for the 'Creative Feedback' workshop sessions over the summer. These

workshop sessions over the summer. These will be your chance to explain to us how the meadows are currently used and will help us as we draw up proposals for improvements. Which brings me nicely to my final topic...

We're in the process of appointing a

landscape architect who will help us draw up some potential options for what we could change in the Meadows; we'll be looking at what can be done to improve the habitat for nature and for local people's access. This landscape architect will be working with us and helping us share all these ideas with you for feedback.
