rd Bath (Avonvale) Scouts had a very active Autumn camp again this year with over 25 Scouts and Cubs travelling to Dorset. Autumn camps are the highlight of Scouting, and this year proved no exception. The cubs (aged 8 – 10) camped from Saturday to Tuesday and the Scouts (aged 10 – 14) camped for a full 6 nights.

As with everything this year, the weather played its part! Both the Cubs and the Scouts had to pitch camp wearing full waterproofs: they showed amazing resilience. They had to battle the elements from the moment they arrived on site until they went to bed. The leaders were so impressed with their positive approach. The day was in fact so wet that one of the tents had to be moved in the evening due to flooding in the field.

Luckily the weather did cheer up quickly and a fantastic camp was had by all. Activities included Climbing on sea cliffs, A-Frame racing, Slacklining, an Escape Room, a Navigation Challenge, Swimming and à la carte Dining (3 courses, all cooked on an open fire). The highlight this year was our day trip to Brownsea Island, where the first ever Scout camp took place in 1907. Group members were able to reconfirm their Scout promise and invest new members and leaders as they stood round the Scouting Memorial Stone.

Autumn Plans:

Batheaston Medical Centre

We try to be as accessible as possible to our patients and strive to provide the best quality of care from both from our clinical team and our administration team.

e want to thank all of our patients who took part in the National GP Patient Survey. On every question our Practice came in above both national and local averages. It was really rewarding for our hard-working staff to receive such fantastic feedback.

Batheaston Medical Centre's patient list is growing, and the range of services we offer is growing too. We work closely with Fairfield Park Health Centre and Widcombe Surgery, all part of the Bath Independents Primary Care Network. Together we employ a Social Prescriber, a Mental Health Practitioner, a Physiotherapist, Pharmacists, and a Paramedic who provides home visits.

Our Reception and Admin. Team is busier than ever - the phone rarely stops ringing. The Team assesses patient requests and navigates people to the appropriate service. For example, we might sometimes refer a patient directly to the Community Pharmacy Team, so freeing up a GP or nurse appointment. The Team can also book a physio appointment for a patient within a week. If the patient insists on seeing a GP first, this referral route could take several weeks.

As you see, we are beginning to work in new ways. Meanwhile our GPs are seeing more patients per day than pre-Covid, and we are having to manage this workload. We will soon be launching an online appointment booking system. Patients will be able to send in a form via our website. Our response might be a prescription sent directly to the chemist, general advice, or, where appropriate, the offer of a GP or nurse appointment.

We need your help!

- Our active Patient Participation Group (PPG) gets together three times a year. We meet to discuss recent Practice changes and to gather your feedback. We are always looking for new members. If you are interested, please contact Julie.higginson1@nhs.net
- The PPG has highlighted our need for volunteer drivers and coordinators to help in transporting elderly and infirm patients to the Practice and to hospital appointments. If you are interested in volunteering for a few hours a week or month, again please contact Julie. higginson1@nhs.net

ow much can be achieved when a community comes together for the benefit of all residents and visitors!

The Playground Working Group was delighted to open the new area of the park last month following the successful completion of Phase 2 of the re-development programme. The area now has exciting new equipment to enhance the play value of the park, and comes with a modern, durable safety surface. The Working Group comprises residents and Parish Councillors. We are enormously grateful for the time and energy that all members contributed in order to deliver the project. And we would also like to thank the volunteers and businesses who were so generous in giving time, skills and resources.

The Parish Council has embarked on a project to rehabilitate the Rhymes. This has stood on the playing fields in Batheaston

for many years. Those that have used the Pavilion in recent times will have noticed that it is a little dilapidated and in need of some care and attention. Our project may require that the Rhymes be replaced eventually by a building that will offer many more facilities for the community than the present building. But before any major work can be done, we need your views on what the community wants and needs. We will be sending out a consultation document. Please respond. The more views and ideas we receive, the better we can ensure that we have a building that suits the needs of Batheaston.

The Suffragette Memorial in Northend will soon be complete. The illustrations and graphics are finished and within the next few weeks the memorial will be open for all to see. It commemorates the essential role that Batheaston played in the Suffragette movement in the early 20th century.

atheaston Twinning Association (BTA) has once again welcomed our Oudon friends. They came in late May on their first visit since 2019.

We had a busy programme. On Friday morning Batheaston School welcomed our visitors to a Question & Answer Session, French stories were read and French songs were sung. Batheaston and Oudon are now running projects about each other's schools, and we hope this marks an enduring cooperation.

We are grateful to BNVH and its committee for acting as our hosts over much of the twinning weekend. It was the first time that the Oudonnais had seen our wonderful hall, to which they had themselves subscribed 500 euros. And it was here we gave them our formal welcome with a "vin d'honneur", a glass of wine. That evening the Pop-Up Pub went all out, even introducing our bemused friends to Morris dancing and "rosbif".

Our guests took Saturday and Sunday daytimes to relax or sightsee. On Saturday

evening we held a ceilidh, with the Canny Band and Forbes Robertson as the caller. Our thanks go to the Parish Council for making us a grant of £500. This allowed us, among other things, to invite villagers to the ceilidh free of charge. On the Sunday late afternoon/evening we ran a relaxed barbecue. Our thanks go to Mary Johnson for being chef de cuisine on both nights. Thanks also go to her helpers, and to Martin Veal for running the barbecue. Again, the weather was kind and younger, more sporty types made good use of the hall field.

We had forty Oudon visitors this year, newcomers and old hands. This was one of our highest numbers to date, and we are grateful to our hosts. We had four new host families. They all said they would do it again, and are up for visiting Oudon next year. Visitors stay with host families without charge or payment. The only cost is travel. Since 2021, Grow Batheaston has run junior football coaching sessions every Saturday at the Batheaston Football Pitch for primary shool age boys and girls. The National Trust is delighted to announce the creation of a 'green corridor' at Bathampton Meadows, linking the historic city centre to surrounding countryside.

e've had a busy few months!
Our volunteers started butterfly surveys back in May and these continue until the end of September. We survey butterflies across much of our land. We've been doing this at Bath Skyline and Prior Park Landscape Garden for many years now, as butterflies are a great indicator of the quality of grassland. Here at the Meadows we've been lucky enough to record small tortoiseshell, peacock, painted lady, red admiral and meadow browns. All this data is being recorded in a national database.

National Trust

In June we had our very first school visit, with children and their teachers spending time exploring the Meadows and having fun on a bug hunt. In July Holly Dabbs held creative art activity sessions for us. And the landscape architect that we're working with held some walking and talking workshops, along with drop-in sessions. Through all these events, and through our online survey, we are capturing your views

on the Meadows. I'm sure key themes will emerge, and we hope to share these with you over the winter. Certainly, many of you want to see more wildlife across the Meadows, while leaving plenty of room for dog walking.

Over the Autumn you may have seen some brown patches in the Meadows. We have been busy testing different wildflower seed mixes. The best performing ones will be seeded in certain areas next spring.

As Autumn gives way to autumn, I'm looking forward to some crisp mornings and warm days at Bathampton Meadows. Meanwhile keep an eye on the noticeboards at both ends of Bathampton Meadows. We're holding another art session with Holly Dabbs on the 23 September. So if you missed out in July, we'd love for you to join this next one.
