## **B&NES** consultation on **London Road crossing**

ath & North East Somerset Council (B&NES) is seeking views on changes to the crossing in the High Street and has provided the following information:

The existing signalised crossings in High Street (near The Batch) and London Road East (near Fiveways) have reached the end of their serviceable life. Much of the equipment is now obsolete and it is no longer possible to keep them maintained in working order.

When signalised crossings have reached the end of their life, we look at whether the equipment should be replaced on a like for like basis or if a different type of crossing would better serve local needs. We must be mindful of what is the most cost-effective way of providing a safe crossing. Signalised crossings generally cost twice as much as a Zebra crossing to install and maintain.

Both crossings were installed before the bypass was open to traffic, when the road carried heavier volumes of traffic than today.

B&NES engineers have observed the usage of these crossings and in both locations, due to the general low volume of traffic, most people do not push the button before crossing.

Based on the speed and volume of traffic and number of people crossing, we should replace both with Zebra crossings. However, due to the brow of the hill and the slight bend in the road in High Street, which can restrict visibility, we will retain this as a signalised crossing.

We are proposing to replace the signalised crossing in London Road East with a Zebra crossing. Unlike a signalised crossing, it always gives priority to pedestrians over vehicles. This means there is less time waiting to cross. Zebra crossings also require less equipment, which would de-clutter the street scene here.

## **National Trust**

The National Trust is delighted to announce the creation of a 'green corridor' at Bathampton Meadows, linking the historic city centre to surrounding countryside.

ith spring on the horizon, let me introduce our wonderful **Bathampton Meadows Volunteers** who regularly engage with our visitors, and help with our conservation and survey work. We now have 25 on the books - without their help we wouldn't have made anything like the progress we have. If whilst out and about you see them in their red tops, do stop and thank them for the incredible work they do. Here's a little more about their various roles.

Walk & Talk Volunteers are our eyes and ears on the ground, letting us know if something needs fixing or requires attention. They chat informally with visitors, noting reactions to the Meadows project. Their surveys give us a picture of who is currently visiting our site and tell us the reasons why they come. There have been some surprising findings! So, if you see our volunteers out and about, feel free to stop them and have a chat.

Conservation Volunteers form weekly working parties. Recently they have been restoring hedgerows in the eastern field. Hedge laying is not only enjoyable, but is also the traditional form of hedgerow management, prolonging a hedge's life and health for years to come.

Over the year Volunteers take photos from fixed points to track seasonal changes. In a few years' time this will give us an interesting record of our progress with habitat restoration. Last year they also worked very hard over many weeks removing old infrastructure and fencing from the site. Now most of the old fencing and barbed wire have gone, leaving the site looking much more natural.

**Butterfly Volunteers survey butterfly** movements weekly through the spring and summer. Last year they provided 28 surveys, and we are looking to increase this total in 2024. The surveys show large and small whites and meadow browns - what we'd expect at present. Hopefully in time ranges and numbers of butterflies will increase.

he Batheaston Brownies have been in existence for approximately forty years, though people who've been in the village longer may say different. It's part of GirlGuiding UK and is for girls aged between 7 – 10 years. We meet on Tuesdays 5.45-7.15pm for all sorts of fun activities. We've done Blindfolded Food Tasting, Hide & Seek in the Dark, we've visited Noah's Ark Zoo Farm, been by train to Weston-Super-Mare, met guide dog puppies in training, celebrated Chinese New Year, had sleepovers and joined with other Brownies for yet more events....

Each term, we have a Powwow when the girls tell us what they want to do, and Marie and I do our best to make this all happen. The girls can also work towards Interest Badges at home. Memorable ones include the Wizard of Oz Badge, where we made ruby slippers; we could still see the red glitter stuck in the Methodist Hall's floorboards months later. We also entered for the Baby Shark Badge when Vanessa the Dentist came and talked to us.

If your daughter would like to join us on a Tuesday evening, please register her at www. girlguiding.org.uk. Click on Register a Child. You'll be asked which group you want to join - we are the 17th Bath (Batheaston) Brownies. Do be aware that we are currently full, with a waiting list of approximately 10 -12 months. This is due to the adult to child ratios set by GirlGuiding UK.

Why not volunteer with us (and shrink the waiting list)? If you're a female over 18 and would like to volunteer with us every Tuesday teatime during term time, please go to the same website and click on Become a Volunteer. You'll be asked to undertake some Safe Space Training and have a DBS clearance check. When these are done, you're good to go. And then we'll be able to welcome more girls, starting them off on their Guiding adventure. There's never a dull moment with the Brownies! And it's so rewarding to see the girls growing in confidence, and with encouragement trying out all kinds of new things.
